This letter is verification that Dr. Tushar Shah received appropriate training for level II certification, as specified by Core Cardiology Training (COCATS) in Adult Cardiovascular Medicine and Society of Cardiovascular Magnetic Resonance, in Cardiovascular Magnetic Resonance (CMR) and Cardiac CT at The Heart Center of Indiana from October 2005 to March 2006. His fellowship in CMR consisted of more than 50 hours of didactic training in the physics and the cardiovascular applications of MRI. In addition to that, he actively participated in the hands-on imaging of more than 200 patients. He served as the primary interpreter of these studies under supervision.

The scope of these studies included cardiac morphology, function, flow imaging, first pass perfusion imaging and delayed contrast enhancement viability imaging, MR angiography including anomalous coronary arteries, bypass grafts, carotid and renal arteries, distal runoffs, cardiomyopathies and congenital heart disease. He actively participated in managing the operations of the CMR center including quality control, staff evaluation, maintenance of accurate databases and records, signal processing and other related operations. He also received training in cardiovascular computed tomography (CT). This training involved basics of CT imaging and its current application in imaging of the coronary arteries, calcium scoring and morphology and function of the heart.

Dr. Shah has become certified level II in both CMR and CT and would be able to function independently in performing these imaging methods.
